Clothing the Loop: Tea Towels to Shopping Bags

Step 1.

Iron your tea towel and cut off any tags





Step 2.
Cut the folded
seam from one
of the LONG
sides. Over sew
the cut edge of
the strip. (This
becomes the
handles)



Step 3.

Cut the strip in half.



Step 4


Cut off the 'double seam' at the ends of the

strip.



Step 5. Placement of the handles:

On the tea towel, measure the length of the longer side containing the intact seam. From both ends place a pin at $1/8^{th}$ the total length, then a pin at $3/8^{th}$ from the edges.



Step 6.Pin a 2cm length of a handle strip to the wrong side of the seam marked by the pins.



Step 7.
Sew the handles to the tea towel. Sew around the edge of the overhang and then a criss- cross in the middle to give a firm hold




Step 8.Fold tea towel in half along the short edge



Step 9.

Sew along the 2 edges and oversew the raw edge at the bottom. (Some rea towels might need trimming at the bottom as they are not all perfect rectangles)



Step 10.

Turn your bag inside out and

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Making a Gusset Bag

Step 11.

With the bag turned so the right side in inside, fold the bottom corners into a triangle.



Step 13.Sew along the marked line. Trim of the corner and oversew the cut edge. Repeat on other side of the bag.





Step 12.

Measure 3 cm from the point along the seam. Draw a line perpendicular to the seam.



Step 14

Congratulations: a recycled tea towel bag with Gusset.
